

Decrease the number of students needing Tier 2 social emotional interventions as measured by the SSIS-SEL by 5% from fall measure to spring measure.

District Goals

~Increase the percentage of students reading at or above grade level and scoring proficient or higher on state assessments in all core content areas by 3%.

~Increase the percentage of IDEA students scoring at developing or higher in ELA, & MA and at/above grade level in RDG as measured by the state assessment by at least 3% at each school in order to decrease the achievement gap between IDEA and non-IDEA students.

~Provide students with social and emotional learning support to improve their mental health well-being, which directly impacts students' ability to learn and grow academically.
